



December 10 1911

We reach the Transantarctic Mountains, The ponies have become very tired, We had shot them!

17 January 1912

My team and I reach the pole but are devastated to see the Norwegian flag flying high.

25 January 1912

My team and I struggle to return. The team, weak and exhausted all have frostbite.

17 February 1912

Evan is still ill and dies a chilly death.

16 March 1912

Oates walks out of the tent, We heard a scream, Oates did not return.

21 March 1912

There was a massive blizzard. We put the tents up. Bowers and Wilson die and I feel I'm next.

29 March 1912

I'm only 10 kilometres from the food supply and sa.....

Scott's Diary

June 1910

My team and I set sail for the South Pole, with excitement and fear, for we did not know that would be there to welcome us. I did not know whether to take the dogs, ponies or tractors, so I took all of them.

January 1911

I pictured it as a white wasteland. I was right! I was the first man in the team to touch the ice. Winter set in fast and night was forever. By October it was warm, so it was safe to travel again. The tractors didn't take long to break down and the ponies were cold and tired because their sweat froze and stuck to them, so I had to shoot them.

4 January 1912

We got to the top of the glacier and Oates, Wilson, Bowers, Evans and I raced to the Pole. One last ridge. NOOOO!!!! Oates let out a cry of rage as we saw the Norwegian flag flying high. I fell to my knees and as I stared at the red tent, I looked inside. I saw two letters, one for the King and one for me. Why in the world did Amunsen send a letter to me? I read it as we hiked to base camp. But then when I thought my luck couldn't get any worse, Evans fell, and never got up again.

14 March 1912

We can walk about 20 km and then head to the main supply of food. Just then I saw Oates walk out of the tent. He never returned. I was hoping to make it to the food supply nearby, but then it happened. The worst blizzard of the year. For two days Wilson, Bowers and I were trapped. One by one we died. First Wilson, then Bowers. I was in the dark with two dead bodies and then death found me and set me away on a breath of wind that night...

My Diary

1910

"50,51,52, all the dogs are packed for the trip!" We checked our sledges for all our supplies. I said, "These are the dogs that are going to take us to the South Pole!"

1911

We arrived at Antarctic on Fram, our ship. We made base camp near the shore. By April the winter had dug in. When I heard that Scott was going for gold I knew a race was unavoidable. Next our party set off to lay down supply depots where they stored food and fuel. October 1911 Warmer weather had come which made travelling possible at last. To loose weight we shave the wood off our sledges and exercised. We did one final check of our supplies.

20 October 1911. My men and I leave camp on our 1.3300 km trek to the Pole. The first supply camp depot told us things to be aware of and wished us luck for the journey.

17. November 1911 My men and I reach the Trans-Antarctic Mountains and we came across a grim 3000m glacier that leads right through the mountains. Almost everyone thought the dogs could not make it, but I did. At the top we came across the flat Antarctic plateau, now the trek is easier. I chose to shoot half the dogs to feed the rest. I only shot the weak ones.

13 December 1911 We came across a flat clear place. The men on the sledges shout "Stop." We looked with amazement. We thought there was a dangerous animal, but it was the South Pole. We have finally made it to the South Pole. We looked for any sign of Scott. There was none. We all raised the Norwegian flag with pride and we put up the darkly coloured tent. I wrote some letters to the King and Queen of Norway. We ate our food with frostbite fingers. We rested for three days and then returned to our base camp.

March 1912 We arrived in Norway on March 17, as heroes. We signed autographs and gave people pictures of our trip.

Deprivation would eventually catch up with the boys!!


The debate over inclusion of these trips may be continuing in an official capacity, however, after attending this specific camp with the boys the merits of this type of excursion are blatantly obvious.








