My best friend is my mom because she makes supper. My mom is always ther for me. She bise me Mackdonilds.

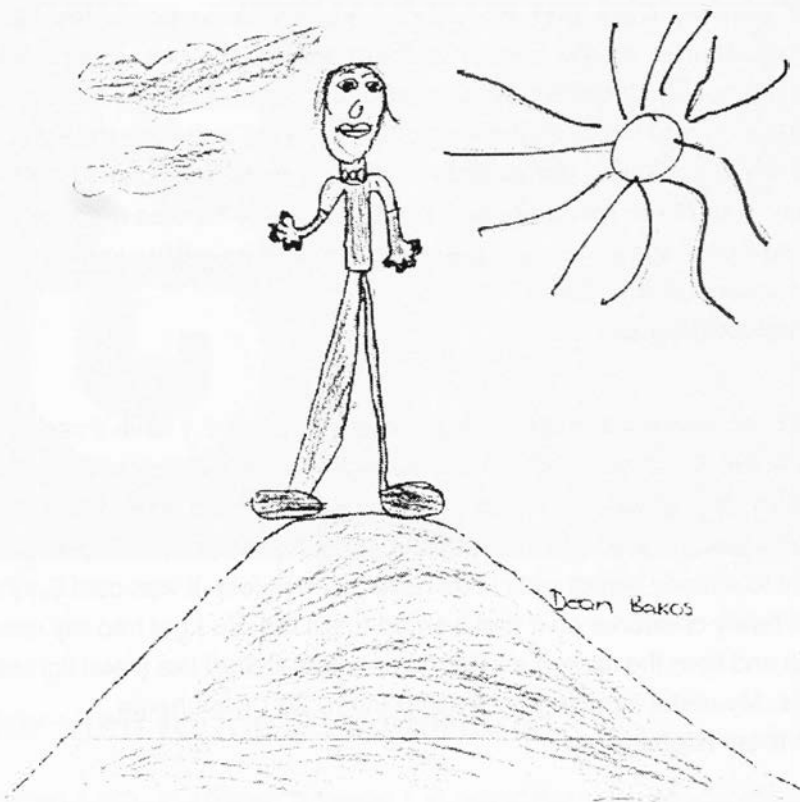

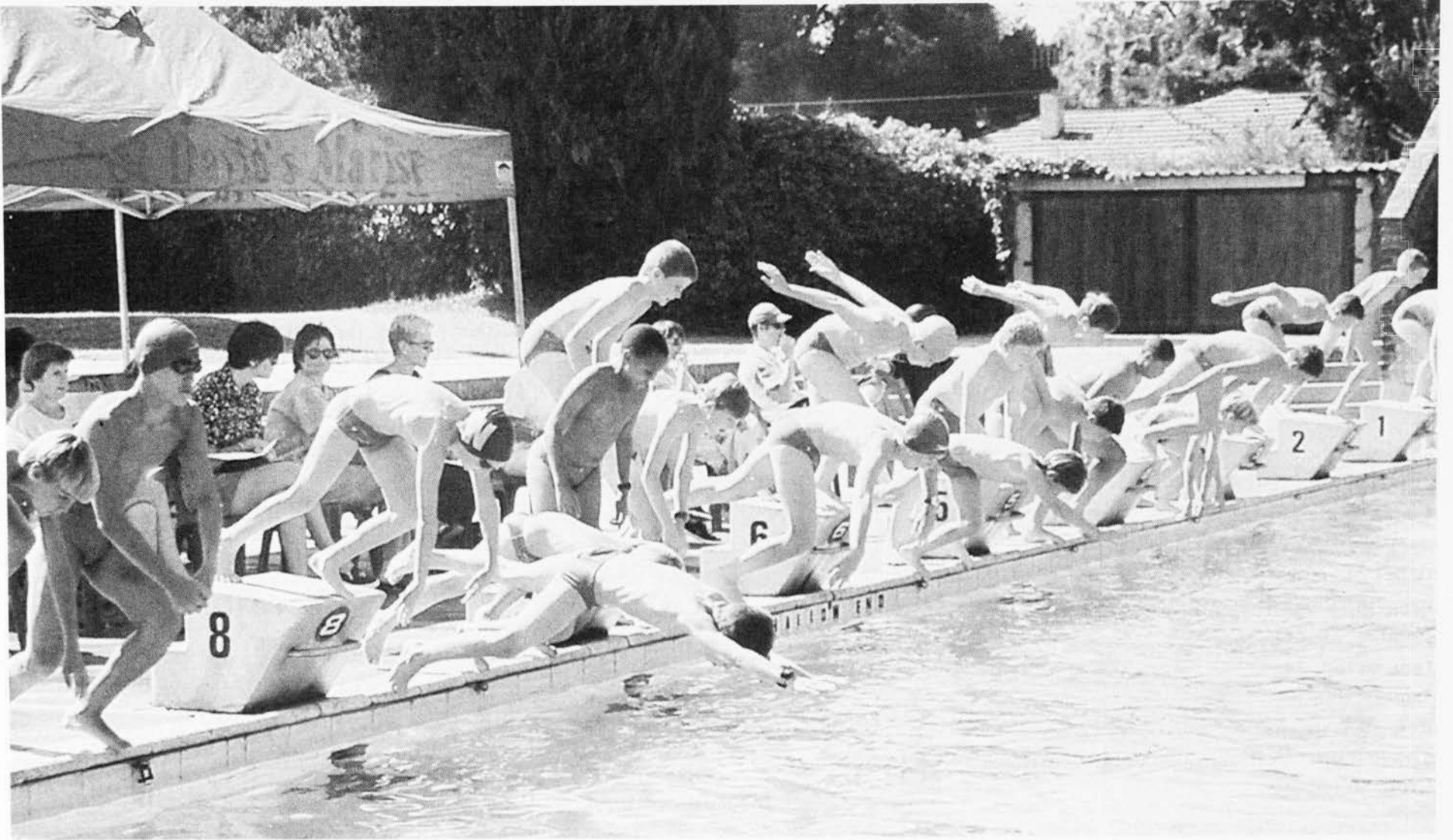
