THE PRINCESS ALICE ADOPTION HOME

The SPCA outreach programme, with the assistance of Mrs Cryer, Mr Mclver and me, has had a most productive and successful year. It is an initiative that is very popular among the boys, 36 of whom were involved in this worthwhile project over the past year.

We are working with the Sandton branch of the SPCA, and have worked closely with Ms Wilna Lamb. It is an extremely well-run branch, with dedicated staff and volunteers. Ms Lamb has provided formal training for all the boys involved. The subject matter consisted of care of the animals, treatment of disease and the adoption process.

Once the boys have received the necessary training, they interact with the animals. There are dogs, pigs, cats, geese, rabbits, chickens, goats and horses. The boys wash the dogs, brush the cats, help with feeding, and spend time socialising the dogs and cats. Socialising is very important, as these animals need human contact in order to be rehomed.

We had two outreach drives this year, which included a civvies day where tins of food collected went to the SPCA, as well as a Topsy Turvy Day, which allowed us to make a generous cash donation.

We and the boys have so enjoyed working with the animals, and will continue to do so next year.

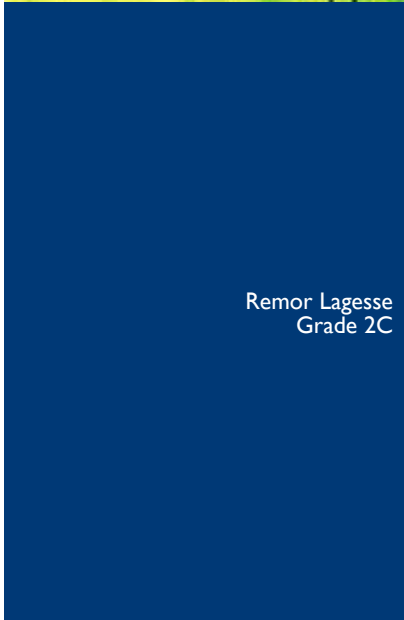

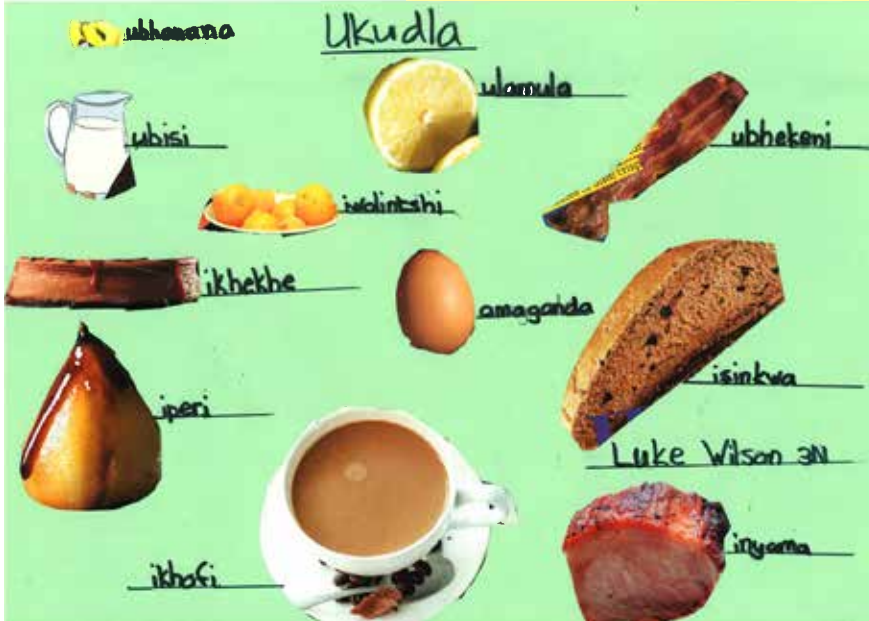

This year has been filled with a variety of fun activities for the boys.

Eight very excited boys left St David's to participate in the annual Kids Lit Quiz, held at St John's on 14 February. We entered two teams: Jack Latilla-Campbell, Connor Woods, Alessandro Gasparotto and Chazya Siwale, and Thomas Purchase, Thomas Charter, Liam Nel and Andrew Kleinhans.

St David's team 1 did really well, scoring 68 points out of 100 and enjoying themselves. Team 2 scored 53 points out of 100. Each year we have improved our score since we first entered the quiz five years ago.

At the end of 2016 we conducted a stock-take and we withdrew a lot of books from our library stock. I received

an appeal from Sue Gordon, a retired school librarian who lives in Port Alfred. St David's was delighted to pass these books on to a needy school. The books were destined for Kuyasa Combined School (1 000 pupils from Grade R to 12) in Nemato, Port Alfred, where Marilyn Pattenden and Sue are developing a library. There is only one other township school in this economically (and educationally) depressed province that has a library. The pupils were thrilled to receive the books.

Over the past four years St David's has competed in the Inter-schools General Knowledge Quiz. Seven schools participate in the quiz: St David's, Beaulieu Preparatory School, St Peter's Boys Preparatory School, St Peter's Girls' Preparatory School, Brescia House, Kyalami Preparatory School and Christchurch Preparatory School.

Ethan Kalell, Ben Fourie, Connor Woods, Jack Latilla-Campbell, Liam Nel, Chazya Siwale, Andrew Kleinhans, Thomas Purchase, Luke Jackson, Jasper Druce and Samuel Hartmann have been enthusiastic participants in these quizzes throughout the year. There are two quizzes each term, and St David's has won two. The boys thoroughly

enjoyed the afternoons and have learnt a great deal, and had fun while learning; and they have done St David's proud. Congratulations, boys, we are proud of your efforts.

The Johannesburg Public Library has a reading quiz for primary school pupils throughout Johannesburg, called Battle of the Books. Six keen bookworms volunteered for this quiz. They had to read 15 books specified by the organisers of the quiz. In September we participated in the first round at Jabula Public Library, where we competed against KEPS and Wendywood Primary School.

The competition was tough and the questions were challenging. St David's was beaten by KEPS by one point. The books that the boys had to read were not genres that they would normally have chosen, but many of them told me that this had introduced them to new and exciting titles that they would not normally have read.

Earlier this year I was privileged to attend the biannual librarians' conference in KZN, where I attended many sessions on new trends in children's reading and literature.

Hooked on Books is always a highlight for the boys, and both the Junior and Senior boys were entertained by

the actors who acted out scenes from popular children's fiction books.

The Grade 6 boys wrote stories for the Grade 00 and Grade 0 boys. Miss Hatfield and I worked with the boys to help them create these stories in Book Creator on their iPads, and to illustrate them. We were fortunate to have a young man, Glad Kaiser of Bala Book Creations, speak to the boys about writing stories and to give them feedback on the stories they had written. This proved to be a most successful exercise, and the boys then went to the Mini Marists and read their stories to the Grade 00 and Grade 0 boys.

Throughout the year I have encouraged the boys to come and make recommendations to me about which books I should buy for the library. This has proved to be most beneficial, as I have been kept up to date as to what the boys are reading and which series of books are popular. After all, this is their library and I must provide books that they want to read. It has been very encouraging to see that the reading statistics for fiction books have risen quite significantly this year.
