## Senior Prep English - Literary Evening

On Wednesday 13 October 1993 Standards 4 and 5 hosted a Literary Evening. This was a new venture for the Prep School and proved to be very popular.
On display were models, made by the boys, to represent background settings for imaginary films based on their set works, 'The Runaways' by Victor Canning, 'The Silver Sword' by Ian Serraillier, the 'Otterbury Incident' by C.Day Lewis and 'Justin' by Dennis A.Gazard. Written descriptions accompanied these models. English 'Supported Self-Studies' were on show as were detailed book reviews and advertising posters drawn by the pupils.
The boys gave readings, made speeches and dramatised parts of their set works in order to illustrate the structure of a novel; what to look for in the study of the novel; the development of plot and character and some of the social and moral issues dealt with in their particular literary works. The latter gave some of our budding actors a chance to show their talents. Gary Geldenhuys as 'Justin' and Kelly Putter as his mother gave such realistic performances that there were audible gasps of horror from the audience when 'mother' delivered her slap! The school scene when poor Mr Jerkins was trying to restore order to an unruly class of boys was also rather close to home!
Part of the Standard 4 and 5 English course is centred around visual literacy and each class studied a film, following a detailed and structured format. This included camera shots and angles, characterisation, plot, theme, and the importance of music to the plot. James Ashforth, John Middlewick and Lyndon Dafert read their detailed film studies on 'Toy Soldiers' and 'The Untamed' aloud, and Rui Jorge spoke about the structure of a film study.
Also displayed were books written and illustrated by the pupils. This was a project designed to make the boys aware of the special skills required to create even the most simple of books. Each story had to have an 'African Theme' and text aimed at the Grade 0 and Grade 1 age-group. The boys had to read their stories aloud to a class of Grades pupils and were marked on presentation, content, reading skills and the reaction of their audience.

Those Grade 0 's are a highly critical bunch!
To close the evening two of the pupils' stories were read aloud to a most appreciative audience of very supportive mums and dads - I am sure they will never forget Kelly Putter's story of 'Leo'.
Our thanks go to all boys who played such an important part in making the evening a success and a special vote of thanks goes to Stefano Contardo, our competent Master of Ceremonies.

The following speech, delivered by Mrs S Bowles opened the 1993 Annual Art Exhibition for the Prep School and the College.
I have a message for all the young artists out there! George Bernard Shaw says in his play 'Man and Superman',
"The true artist will let his wife starve, his children go barefoot and his mother drudge for his living at seventy, sooner than work at anything but his art".
Well! you've already worn out your mothers - making them schlep you back and forth to school for anything up to twelve years and if you are labouring under any of the other delusions, let me assure you that your children will never go barefoot, except in Plett or Sandy Bay - Oh no! They will be clamouring for Doc Munchkins at R 700,00 per pair, or J R Ewings or some such equally expensive 'in' footware. You won't need to let your wives starve, they'll be starving themselves anyway on some sinister diet of grapefruit and coffee or paw-paw and pickles.

The part about your not wanting to work at anything but your art - I can believe - I've taught most of you!
Seriously though, ladies and gentlemen, just look around at the exhibition here tonight. Look at the colour, feel the vitality and the warmth listen to the messages of simplicity and maturity coming through and you will agree with John Ruskin that "Fine art is that in which the hand, the head and the heart of man go together."
Here at St Davids we pride ourselves on educating the whole child. It would be so easy to ignore art, music, drama and give the time spent on these creative subjects over to those subjects which are more easily measured in terms of academic achievement. We could mould our pupils - each into the prescribed shape; fill each brain with the same old stereotyped thoughts and insist on conformity in all things. But, we don't! Our philosophy is based on the encouragement of individuality, creativity and free thinking. We want our pupils to develop well-balanced psyches - able to appreciate art in all forms.
I feel very much a part of the art department at St David's. No, I don't give art lessons, but my classroom is next door but one to the art room! The art teacher is slightly kinky (aren't all art teachers?). She knows that we have been encouraged to play music whilst the pupils are working, (motivates the right side of the brain I believe!) - but HEAVY METAL? and David Kramer? There always seems to be a
crowd of little boys outside my classroom windows, flying paper aeroplanes, or drying dripping finger paintings or lying full length on pieces of paper while their friends draw around them. All this to the accompaniment of shrieks of joy.
Well, they say that art without practice is nothing - and that it should take reality by surprise.
It does indeed.
Children are instinctive artists. Their uninhibited work holds lessons for adult professional artists.
Art satisfies some deep human need for expression in a variety of media, be it clay or cloth, metal or material, wood or wallpaper pen and pencil, paint and plastic. Children love art. Let us then enjoy their work together this evening and make a pact to keep the flame of creativity burning in our boys and carry on the good work started by Heather Joseph and Anneke Carter.
I don't really mind the noise outside room 8, after all an artist himself Emile Zola said once - "If you ask me what I came to do in this world, I, an artist, I will answer you, $\underline{I}$ am here to live out loud."

## Declamation/Deklamasie 1993

The highlight of my year in the Public Speaking business is adjudicating St David's prep school English Declamation and Afrikaans Deklamasie - not the easiest of tasks by any means. But definitely the most enjoyable!
Once a year some twenty-four to thirty boys from both the junior prep and the senior prep are given the opportunity to try out their oratory skills in front of an audience consisting not only of their teachers and peers, but of their admiring parents, grand-parents and other members of their families as well. They prepare weeks in advance for their one-to-two-minute speeches, polishing and perfecting their thoughts and their performances, and come bright-eyed and eager to present their masterpieces, and masterpieces they most assuredly are! Their sharp little minds produce originality, surprise, information and entertainment such as no adult with his inhibitions or practised logic seems ever able to do. They make use of visual aids (their adeptness at using the overhead projector would make any experienced public presenter drool!), they project their voices, vary their pace and pitch with uncanny alacrity and singular skill, and they hold the audience enthralled.
With the 'Afrikaanse Deklamasie' I never cease to be amazed at the ease with which these young men use their second, and often third, language. It is heartening to hear them use the Afrikaans language with such facility and grace. They start in the junior section by performing in groups and later progress towards individual presentations of poems or speeches, and in both cases they surprise the audience with their skill and fluency.
The parents could never over-estimate the enormous effort and many hours that the class teachers spend on the preparation of these most worthwhile events, and if medals could be handed to these dedicated people, they would, each and every one receive gold! But, at the end of the day, full credit has to go to the boys for their show of courage and incredible confidence in standing up there and holding a big, and definitely scary audience in the palms of their hands.
I want to use the words of Louis IV when he told Massilon: "I have heard many great orators and have been highly pleased with them; but whenever I hear you, 'boys of St David's' Igo away displeased with myself". The Greeks maintained that a man's character is revealed by his speech. If that is so, then, judging by what we see and hear at the Annual English Declamation and 'Afrikaanse Deklamasie', we can all be proud of the characters of our St David's boys.
