## **HEADMASTER'S REPORT**



Dear Prep Parents

This has been an incredibly challenging year; a year that will be talked about for many years to come. No one could have predicted 2020, and equally, no one would have been able to forecast the tremendous paradigm shifts education would be forced to implement. I have

maintained that education has seen very little fundamental change during the past 100 years. In the last couple of years, the terminology around 21st Century skill sets has been the talk within educational corridors, but these skill sets seemed to have a timeframe within which they would be weaved into our existing educational development. Covid-19 fast-tracked these and other necessary skillsets at a pace that has shaken education to its core. It is incredible to reflect on how we managed to pivot to an online programme of distinction, within a period of 48 hours! I have said it before, but it certainly is worth repeating: I remain in awe, and I am so proud of all the staff, who managed this "impossible mission". We have learnt an incredible amount this year, the most important being that we are agile, and we can adapt at the drop of a hat. We are unsure of what 2021 will throw at us, but I do take comfort in the fact that we can face head-on any challenge that may present itself.

We are sad to be saying goodbye to a few of our staff, and send them on the next leg of their journey with our gratitude for their time and impact at St David's, and with our very best wishes for the adventures that lie ahead.

At the beginning of this term, Ms Busakwe handed in her resignation and she will be joining St Stithians Girls' Prep school in 2021. Ms Busakwe has made a significant impact in the short time she has been with us. She is an excellent teacher and firm, but kind in her discipline, and is always willing to try new ideas. We wish her Godspeed and great happiness in her new role.

Both her and Mrs Land's (who left for the UK earlier this year) positions were advertised on the ISASA webpage, and we received in excess of 180 applicants. We were delighted with many of the applicants and the interviewing panel was unanimous in their final decisions. I am thrilled to report that Mrs Dendere will join us as a Grade 3 Class teacher, and Ms Ramoshaba will join us as a Grade 2 Class teacher. Mrs Dendere is an experienced teacher having taught at St Mary's School for Girls and more recently, she has been the Associate Dean of Instruction at Nova Pioneer. Ms Ramoshaba has completed her BEd Honours degree,

and she has been teaching at Risidale Primary for the past two years.

At the end of the year, two of our current internship candidates come to the end of their journeys with us at St David's. We wish both Ms Chabant and Mr De Robillard all the very best as they continue their life-journeys. Both have had impacts on so many of our boys, and I have no doubt they will continue to positively influence young peoples' minds.

Mr Dickson will be joining our staff as a full-time employee from I January 2021. He will initially cover for Mrs Mather (Grade 6) who is taking a sabbatical to spend time with her mother who is terminally ill. When she returns to our employ, Mr Dickson will be redeployed to the English and Mathematics departments.

Ms Malane joins our internship programme next year. She will be focusing on assisting in the Afrikaans department in the Junior Primary, and spear-heading the development of a new internship programme for 2022 under the mentorship of Mrs Bowden.

After an extensive review of the numerous roles and responsibilities of the Senior Prep deputy headmaster, we have decided to diversify this role; and from January 2021, Mr Howard will focus on operations and logistics within the whole Prep. His position will be the Senior Deputy Headmaster: Prep School. With his change in role, I am delighted to report that Mrs Nair has been appointed as the new Director of Academics in the Senior Prep. She brings with her many years of educational wisdom particularly in curriculum development and innovation. Her new role has also offered growth opportunities for our staff and here too, I am pleased to report that Mr Campbell has been appointed as the new Head of Afrikaans, and Mr Nkabinda has been appointed as the Grade 6 Coordinator.

We have come to the end of the first term (three years) for most of the present Grade Heads. The staff have been offered the opportunity to express an interest in being considered as a new Grade Coordinator. The following have been appointed as Grade Coordinators for 2021:

Mrs Swartbooi (nee Lodewyk) and Mrs Dugmore have signed further one-year contracts to assist in the Mini Marist. They have been locuming in the Junior Prep for most of this year and they have settled in very well in the Mini Marist.

We have been able to re-configure the Mini Marist classrooms using the revised Department of Basic Education directives to accommodate all the boys in their designated classrooms. The outside covered areas funded by the PTA, will continue to be used as break-away spaces to enhance our inquiry-based learning (IBL) pedagogical approach. We are hopeful that the necessary tiling for the outside area (Grade 00 classes) and the "new" sandpit will be completed before we begin next year.

Across the Prep, stimulating and innovative lessons have continued to take place in the classrooms using Google Classroom as our learner management system. In addition, some compelling websites and platforms have been used to add to the content that has been taught this term. Teachers have continued to collaborate and share with each other their ideas and lesson plans. There has been a real sense of comradery and collaboration amongst the staff. Moreover, the rapid move to digital learning has allowed the staff to develop their own curriculum resources with a particular focus on ensuring we "South Africanise" these resources.

Looking forward to 2021, we have already begun to plan for the "effects" of 2020. There have been some unintended consequences from online learning. As such we have coined the beginning of next year as: "Picking up the Pieces of 2020". We have considered both the academic and psychosocial impact on our boys. We have already conducted a skills audit across the school to check if there are any deficits. At the beginning of next year, we will first attend to these deficits before we move on to the content in each subject. Our Wellness department will also be more actively involved from the start of the year intervening on an emotional and academic level.

Unfortunately, the pandemic has played havoc with our "Beyond our Gates" outreach programme this year.

However, despite these many challenges, we were still able to make a difference in the lives of others less fortunate than ourselves.

The boys' visits to the SPCA and Princess Alice Adoption home were cancelled, but we tried to support our long-standing charities in other ways. As part of our Champagnat Day celebrations, we asked parents to make up a hamper of baby goods, animal food or human food. The adoption home received the baby goods, and the animal food was delivered to the SPCA. Charity Fusion collected the human food which was delivered to needy people. The Mini Marist "Meals on Wheels" sandwich drive was well supported on the day.

Similarly, the St David's community supported the Pledge Drive launched in conjunction with the Feast Day of Jean-Baptiste Montagne. The funds raised were donated to the Alexander Education Committee (AEC), which is one of our educational outreach partners.

At the end of October, we made an appeal for old blankets and towels that were sent to the SPCA.

We received an appeal from Charity Fusion for money to support a soup kitchen and an amount of R5 000 was donated to them.

As part of our Christmas celebrations, we asked the St David's community to donate baby goods and toiletries, or non-perishable food. The donations collected have far exceeded our expectations and a significant delivery has been sent to the Adoption Home and St Martin's Development Home in Delmas.

While we have not been able to support our longstanding charities in our usual way, we made a conscious

attempt to offer them some support upon which they have come to rely quite heavily.

However, what was particularly heart-warming to see was the way in which individual boys and their families responded to the alarming needs that arose during the pandemic.

The St David's canoeists were involved in various projects that raised money to support under-resourced clubs. Their efforts have been greatly appreciated and they also assisted needy families by providing food parcels.

Some of our boys were involved in making pots of soup or muffins. They then delivered these to shelters for the homeless. Other boys made cloth face masks and delivered them to vulnerable individuals. Some members of our community knitted and crocheted squares which have been stitched into blankets. These cot blankets were donated to the Princess Alice Adoption Home.

As the year draws to a close and we reflect on our outreach activities for 2020, we are proud to be able to say that, without question, the St David's community has responded wholeheartedly to the emerging needs in our society and we continue to be beacons of Marist light in our turbulent world, as we are called to do as a Marist community.

Earlier in November, the department of Student Affairs announced the house leaders for 2021 at the Senior Prep assembly. It was a thorough selection process, and I am thrilled with the group of leaders we will have for 2021. All have understood and appreciated that these positions are not rewards, but positions of responsibility and that the hard work now begins. With the change in the allowance of sport and other cultural activities, it has been a pleasure to observe how many boys have taken advantage of these sporting and cultural opportunities. The integrated day has been a huge success and certainly a positive that we can use going into 2021. Of course, the boys want competition and we are all looking forward to the possibility of inter-school competition in 2021.

From a cultural and music perspective, we have continued with most of our individual instrument lessons online, with a few boys doing live lessons at school. One of the highlights of this term was the Virtual Arts Week, which involved the Music, Art and Drama departments. All boys had a chance to showcase their art works; the marimba boys were excited to play together again; our young musicians showed off their talents and were inspired by seeing some of the College boys' performances; some of our actors took on the challenge of recording themselves performing a monologue. It was my pleasure to watch the virtual YouTube cultural clips; our boys relished the opportunity to showcase their cultural talents, especially those who decided to take up an instrument during lockdown. The art was of an exceptional standard and my thanks must be extended to Mrs Human, Mrs Kantor and Mrs Meiring.

The other highlight has been our virtual Carols Service, which was recorded on 24 November and will be released to the community on the last day of school.

With the reintroduction of non-contact sport, we have been delighted with the number of boys who have taken advantage of our voluntary sport and cultural offerings in the afternoons. Moreover, the integrated school day has been exceptionally successful and many of the specialist coaches have been able to spend quality coaching time with the boys.

At the Heads of Sports meeting, it was agreed that all the prep schools will follow the usual sporting calendar for 2021. However, it is expected that the Covid-19 protocols will remain in place and thus, all inter-school fixtures will be held without any spectators. Parents will be required to drop off their sons and collect them at the end of any fixture. Moreover, all boys arriving on our campus from other schools will be required to be screened and all will have to complete the pre-screening form. The logistics around these protocols are still being discussed among all the schools, but the principle is to create consistency among the schools concerned.

We remain unsure of inter-school contact sport fixtures and only once we have received clear guidelines from the Department of Basic Education, will the calendarised fixture lists become active for these sports. This too applies to any inter-school sports festivals.

This has been a trying year for all our specialist and part-time coaches; however, we are very grateful for the generous donations received from parents that have allowed for these coaches to continue to be remunerated.

We are very excited with the new foundations that were laid earlier in the year with respect to basketball and swimming in particular. The successful introduction of our Learn To Swim programme, and the inclusion of specialist swimming coaches, stands us in good stead for 2021. The same is true of our basketball footprint which has grown significantly in the past 18 months. Our focus in all our sporting codes remains on participation, and fair and equitable coaching for all our boys.

Following a thorough proposal to the Development and Facilities subcommittees, and subsequent approval from the Board, we are delighted to announce that from 2022, we will be increasing our Grade 00 intake by another class. Plans are being finalised and it is envisaged that the necessary build will occur during 2021. We will ensure minimal disruption to the functioning of the Mini Marists and, of course, all necessary safety measures will be in place. The build will consist of an extra classroom space, the increase in ablutions for both the boys and staff, a larger meetings space for teachers and parents, and a multi-purpose hall. The plans will be circulated once these have been finalised.

The frenetic pace at which this term has progressed has been interesting to observe. With almost all our boys and staff back on campus full-time, it has been my pleasure listening to the joy, laughter and general hustle and bustle around the campus. The boys are our lifeblood and their presence back on campus has certainly rejuvenated the staff. We have remained focused on the academic programme and allowed the boys to consolidate where they are at present within their own academic journeys. In many cases, boys have come on in leaps and bounds, and in others there are still several unintended consequences we will have to address going into 2021. One such concern is the learnt behaviour of extended screen time - the boys have become accustomed to spending significant amounts of time in front of a screen. This has resulted in some regression in social skills. However, the more time the boys have spent at school, the more they have been able to interact with each other and allow for the incredibly important socialisation process to continue. Furthermore, many of the boys have had to internalise tremendous economic and social distress. The consequences of these experiences will have to be monitored going forward, as mentioned above.

To ensure some consistency at the beginning of next year, we will begin 2021 the same way as we have ended this

year. This will allow us to understand where we are as a country re Covid-19 and adapt if necessary. The only significant changes will be the opening of Ist Avenue as a drop-and-go option; allowing the Grade Is to walk with their parents to their new classes for the first 10 days (all Grade I boys and their parents will proceed through the screening process before going to class); and lastly, the return to our usual school uniform. In addition, we have penciled in all the usual sporting and cultural fixtures, and tours, but we will not book any tours until we understand our Covid-19 situation next year. Also, we will begin the necessary grade camp inspections early in the term to ensure all camps are compliant and we are comfortable with their risk protocols and safety measures in place. Again, we will only commit to these grade camps once we are fully aware of the Covid-19 scenario in South Africa.

The staff, as most people who have managed work, family and Covid-19 stress this year, are exhausted, and I cannot thank them enough for all they have done. In all cases, every staff member has gone out of their way to help each other. Furthermore, they have offered their assistance in areas that may not have initially fell within their usual area of employment. This has been a pleasure to note, and it has reinforced our pillar of family and community. They certainly deserve a well-earned rest.

Much has changed and I remain steadfast in the belief that we must take the positives of this challenging year and ensure we entrench these going forward.

Our achievements this year would not have been possible without the unbelievable support of the Prep Executive, the school executive and the Board. In particular I would like to thank the Prep Executive, and especially Mrs Mills and Mr Howard. We have a dynamic executive, who is unafraid of vigorous debate. Yet, in all our deliberations, their wise council, support and guidance have allowed us to remain true to our Marist values and, importantly, to our boys and staff. It has been my pleasure to be surrounded by such a dynamic, energetic, positive and wisdom-driven Executive. All have been my beacons of light this year, and I thank all most sincerely.

I wish every St David's family a blessed Christmas, a restful holiday with family and friends, and a happy and safe New Year. We all deserve a healthy break, and whatever 2021 presents, we will be ready!
