

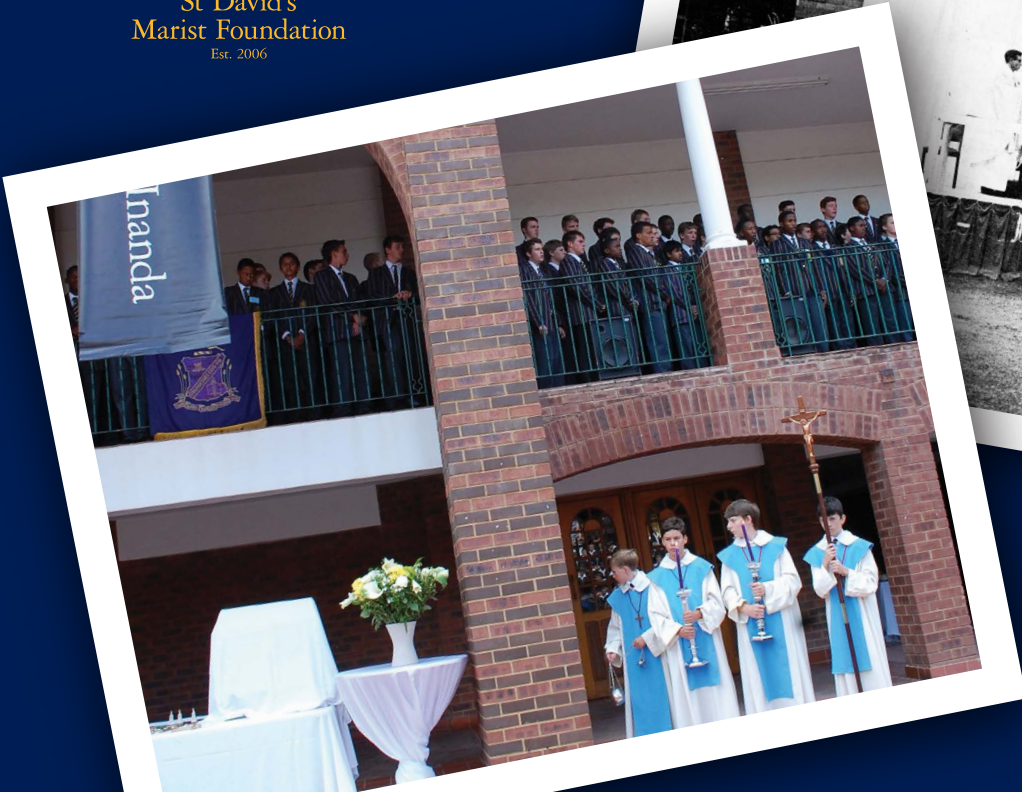

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# FROM THE CHAIRMAN

This report covers the 2014 Financial Year and includes extracts from the audited Annual Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

As in prior years, it is appropriate to continue to remind ourselves of the objects of the Foundation:

- The main object is to receive donations from third parties for the purpose of:
  - applying such funds for education and development at the School; and
  - the provision of support services to, or the promotion of, the common interests of the School.
- Furthermore, the Foundation may provide funding and support services in the furtherance of the main object of the Foundation for other purposes such as:
  - the provision of related and associated education and development courses in relation to academic enrichment, academic support, supplementary tuition or outreach programmes for the disadvantaged and the provision of scholarships, bursaries and awards for study programmes, research and teaching;
  - to erect or contribute to the cost of erection of any buildings required for or incidental to the promotion of the purpose and objectives of the Foundation;
  - to supplement the salaries of any existing or future teachers at the School; and
  - to initiate and participate in fundraising ventures to raise funds to promote the objects of the Foundation

Other key subsets of the objects include:

- securing long-term, sustainable funding for the School;
- raising the capital required to support bursary and development programmes from the income derived from such capital;
- promote meaningful transformation within the School.

Central to these objectives is ensuring that the St David's boys receive a balanced education which is grounded in the Marist philosophy and to maintain the standards and diversity required in the modern South Africa.

The Foundation's cumulative efforts to date are presented below:

- Donations received R12, 851 million;
- Committed pledges to be received R2, 257 million;
- Dividends and interest received, less expenses R3, 370 million
- Realised and unrealised gains on Investments R10, 775 million; and
- Awards made R6, 687 million
- Net capital as at 31 December 2014 R20, 309 million.

## The year under review

The Trustees and I are again pleased with the performance of the Foundation's Asset Managers who continued to deliver investment returns in excess of the market average.

An investment return of 19.1% (27.1%) for the year was achieved. As at the end of 2013, the split of the funds under management is 81.6% (77.6%) in listed equities, 0.0% (0.0%) in listed property portfolios and the balance of 18.4% (22.4%) in cash and cash equivalents. The cash held over the year-end period was considered to be a temporary strategy, pending a correction in market prices during the first quarter of 2015.

The Foundation's investment strategy remains consistent. Capital growth in excess of inflation, with a view to making annual awards of 4 - 6% of opening capital to qualifying programmes and those specifically requested by our donors.

Despite an increase in the activities on the part of the Foundation office to heighten the awareness of the objectives of the Foundation, donations dropped slightly in 2014, which probably reflected the on-going sluggish economic environment in the country. However, we, the trustees, remain confident that our donor base will continue to grow in the years to come.

In review of our activities in the 2014 (2013) year :

- The Foundation's fundraising efforts raised a total of R943 788 (R1 173 969), being approximately 5.5% (8.7%) of the opening capital at the beginning of the year.
- The net value gains from its investment activities, net of expenses, amounted to R2 645 434 (R2 902 133).
- Awards paid to the school amounted to R1 184 390 (R849 237) being 6.8% (6.3%) of the opening capital at the beginning of the year. The Foundation's capital, after expenses and awards to the school increased by 17.4% (28.1%) to R 20 309 537 (R 17 295 421) as at 31 December 2014 (2013).

The Advancement Office, under the leadership of Lara Klement, continues to make significant progress towards improving and growing the Alma Mater data. This has certainly helped to enhance the general communication with the Old Boys. During the year, several successful Old Boys' events were held around the country and in Australia.

The School continues to cover the operational expenses of the Foundation office, and it is heartening to see that the Foundation has become an integral part of the School. It is important to recognize the School's contribution to the Foundation in this regard.

We welcomed Mr Mark Bussin as a Trustee this year and our thanks are also extended to Mr Cleo Artemides who retired from office during the year. Fiona Budd joined the Foundation office team, and her experience and knowledge has added a positive energy to the Foundation office team.

## Looking ahead

The goal of the Foundation is to be able to fully support a minimum of five learners per grade from Grade 4 onwards, plus a minimum of two teacher education bursaries per annum. Currently, a total of seventeen boys (including three at a tertiary institution) enjoy the financial support of the Foundation. Whilst this is a good start, there is still some way to go in order to achieve the level of forty-five boys as the minimum objective. The capital target to support the stated objective was originally set at R25 million. However, due to inflationary pressure, this continues to be an upward and moving target. What is heartening to note, however, is that the cumulative income of the Foundation since 2007, net of expenses but before awards to the school, reached close to R29m in 2014.

In addition to providing academic support, the Foundation also seeks to raise funds in support of specific capital development projects which the school has planned for the future. The main project that will be managed under the auspices of the Foundation is a multi-purpose building (the 'Maristonian') which will include a 'home' for our Old Boys - a place for our Alumni and our community to meet, but also to be used by the School as a multi-purpose space. Subsequent to the current reporting period, this project received the requisite approvals from the Marist Brothers, and fundraising for this exciting venture will commence in earnest.

The "Jubilee Campaign" still remains the major initiative for the Foundation through to 2016. This Foundation initiative has, and continues to receive, prominence at school functions and in various communication media. The message of a broader donor base and a manageable, sustained giving plan over a longer period continues to be communicated to parents, Old Boys and other stakeholders. This Campaign, as anticipated, has had a slow start, but is finding traction as the plans and projects for 2016 become crystallised. The Foundation and the School Executive have strengthened their resolve to increase the awareness of the Campaign through a more intensive communication programme, as 2016 looms.

For the forthcoming year (2015), the Foundation has resolved to award an amount of approximately R 1 400 000 (R1 184 390) to the School for bursary awards.

The Foundation would not exist without the support of its donors. I extend deep gratitude on behalf of the Trustees and the School for all the pledges, donations, bequests and other contributions made by donors, past and present. This generosity is much appreciated. I would also like to make a special mention of the contributions made by the Trustees, Lara Klement, Fiona Budd and Cheryl King. Mr Brian Kalil continues to be of great assistance in the financial management and reporting of the Foundation and for his role as auditor.

To the School's Executive and Board of Governors, the Marist Schools' Council, the Foundation Office, the Marist Old Boys' Association and the Trustees, a special word of gratitude for your continued support. At the time of writing, it is pleasing to note that the first quarter of 2015 has yielded many positive achievements for the school in general and the Foundation in particular, and it is my sincere hope that the next Foundation report will be filled with positive achievements in 2015 and healthy prospects in the years ahead.

# FROM THE ADVANCEMENT MANAGER

## Launch out into the deep

*"...and He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little way from the land. And He sat down and began teaching the people from the boat. When He had finished speaking, He said to Simon, 'launch out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.' Simon answered and said, 'Master, we worked hard all night and caught nothing, but I will do as You say and let down the nets...'"*

The aforementioned passage of scripture taken from Luke 5:7 is one which has often inspired and challenged me and I am sure many others who have read it. I would like to think that it might also have inspired the young French priest, Marcellin Champagnat, nearly 200 years ago as he contemplated the role he was to play as a newly ordained priest living in a country ravaged by the effects of the French Revolution. As with many individuals who have decided on a life's mission, a singular incident strongly influenced the ultimate course of Marcellin's life: called to the bedside of a sick young boy, Marcellin was moved and dismayed by the fact this boy had received no schooling and had never heard the Gospel. This incident finally inspired Marcellin to start the teaching order that would become what we today know as the "Marist Brothers" and in 1818, the first 'Marist School' was opened in LaValle France and still operates today.

The question occurs to me, just as in the passage of Christ and his disciples: what it is that inspired those around Marcellin to follow his vision? Why would someone follow the call to action of another when, I am sure, they too had ideas of what they would like to do with their time, resources and lives in general.

Although much has been written about the qualities and skills of inspirational leaders, a common attribute seems to be their courage to have a transformational vision. It takes courage to challenge the status quo, to be willing to sacrifice for a cause, to speak a truth you believe - even if it is unpopular - to leave the shores of your country, as the Marist brothers did, to take their vision and message to every continent of the world. Equally, it takes courage for us to be good parents, to be good teachers, to be good citizens. It takes courage for our boys to run onto a sports field against opponents from schools twice our size, to resist peer pressure, to perform to an audience. It takes courage for our little ones to leave the safety of the side of the pool and take their first strokes. It takes courage to launch out into the deep. *Confortare esto vir*, is, I don't believe by chance, our school motto. *Take courage and be a man.*

It takes courage to have a transformational vision. Not just any vision, not one that will be printed on vision boards and put on our websites and promotional flyers. A transformational vision - one that is measured against the impact that it has to change the existing order where necessary, to change the quality of peoples' lives and the society they live in. The vision of St Marcellin was a transformational one, to educate the poor; to empower through education. A vision shared by Nelson Mandela in his statement that "education is the most powerful tool that we have to change the world."

Nearly 200 years after start of the first Marist school, we find ourselves in the heart of Sandton as a direct result of the courageous, transformational vision of St Marcellin Champagnat. His vision has transcended time and space, passed down, it would seem, from one generation to the next by those who have been immersed in the Marist ethos. However, in order for this vision to remain true and strong, it has needed yet more courageous men and women, willing to live the values that define "Marist". I strongly believe that it is what continues to attract so many families to us today. Yes, we have magnificent facilities and excellent staff and we have

phenomenal sporting and cultural programmes. However, I think that it is our values that attract families and others to us, even if it is not something they consciously articulate. This shared value system is what makes us 'family', and it is this 'Family Spirit' which makes us so strong.

I am often asked, in the marketing space, what it is that makes us different from other schools who also have excellent academics, facilities and teachers and I can honestly say that it is this sense of family, bonded by a common value system. We see it daily, in the relationships that we share with each other. Our school is a place where families and friends meet, be it in our Chapel, the carpark, on the sides of a sports field, in the tuckshop, around the braai on a Saturday morning, around the boardroom table as PTA or Board members or Trustees or in one of hundreds of other touch points. What is invested into our school on a daily basis in terms of time, resources, prayer and goodwill from our 'family' makes us a very strong school indeed. Strong in all the right senses of the word. Family makes our children feel secure, the roots of family often give us the courage to fly. The roots our boys develop as members of the Marist family give them the courage to launch out into the deep. And we are often amazed at the stories we receive back about what our Old Boys are doing in the world – brave and bold and transformational stories.

Eight years ago, the School took a courageous decision to start the St David's Marist Foundation. The aim was to help secure the long-term sustainability of St David's, as well as support the school in achieving its strategic objectives - in essence to ensure the continuation of the work that was started by St Marcellin, continued by the Marist Brothers and now by Marist laity for the benefit of generations to come. We are proud of the progress we have made as a Foundation and the impact that we have had on the lives of the boys and young men we support through the Foundation. However, the true credit lies in the hands of the many donors who have chosen to play a part in investing in St David's and the lives of the boys who pass through its corridors each day.

We are blessed to have a community who support our Marist vision financially, who believe that what we do and how we do it is worth preserving and worth investing in. The financial generosity of our donors has provided the opportunity for four new boys to start their journey at St David's in Grade 8 in 2015. We also celebrate the fact that four young men who have been supported by the Foundation matriculated at the end of 2014 and each one is enrolled at a University for 2015. We wish them every success as they launch out beyond the gates of St David's.

Our 75th Jubilee looms in the near future – 2016 sees us celebrate this milestone in our history. We believe that this is a unique opportunity for the current generation of St David's to leave a legacy by supporting one or more of our Jubilee fundraising initiatives focussed on our Bursary Programme and the building of 'The Maristonian', a multi-purpose building that will incorporate a 'home' for our Alumni.

It may well be asked why anyone, like St Marcellin and many others, would commit their life to the service and betterment of others and I can only guess that it is done out of a deep love for humanity. Interestingly, the earliest origins of the word Philanthropy had nothing to do with money, but could be translated from ancient Greek as 'love of humanity' a word used by the ancient Greek gods to describe their love for humans. I like this definition as it speaks powerfully to the fact that many people who commit their lives, or an aspect thereof to the betterment of others, do so out of love. St Marcellin said that to teach children and to teach children well, one had to first love them.

This wonderful poem, by Maya Angelou, speaks to this:

***Touched By An Angel*** by Maya Angelou

We, unaccustomed to courage  
exiles from delight  
live coiled in shells of loneliness  
until love leaves its high holy temple  
and comes into our sight  
to liberate us into life.

Love arrives  
and in its train come ecstasies  
old memories of pleasure  
ancient histories of pain.  
Yet if we are bold,  
love strikes away the chains of fear  
from our souls.

We are weaned from our timidity  
In the flush of love's light  
we dare be brave  
And suddenly we see  
that love costs all we are  
and will ever be.  
Yet it is only love  
which sets us free

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge some special people. Willy Castle (who retired as Headmaster of the Preparatory School at the end of 2014) who is the epitome of a man who has dedicated his life to Marist education and to our St David's boys. A man with a heart of courage, filled with love. To Cheryl King, who will be leaving St David's and embarking on an adventure with her husband Dave to Australia in mid-2015, for 16 years of dedicated service to St David's and to being an integral component to the success of the Foundation and the Marist Old Boys Society. The Trustees of the St David's Marist Foundation who give selflessly of their time, wisdom, resources and good humour.

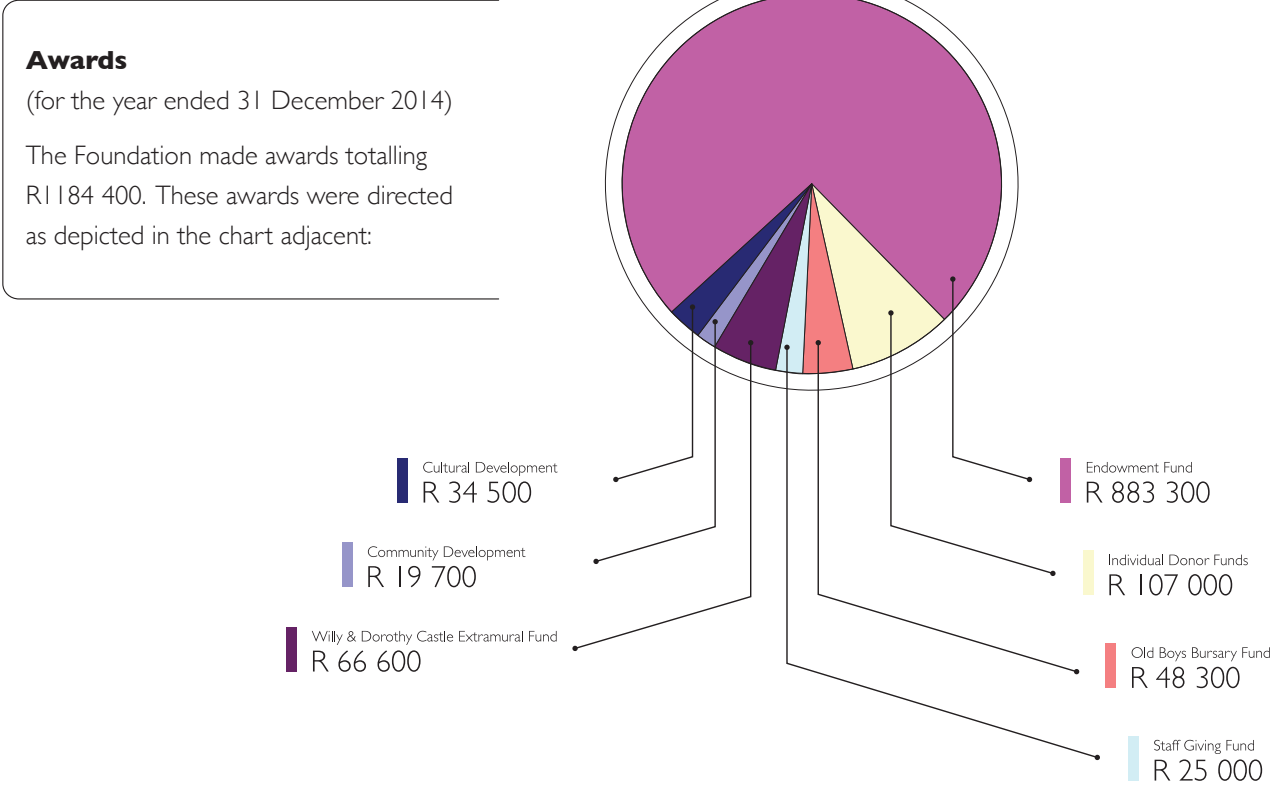
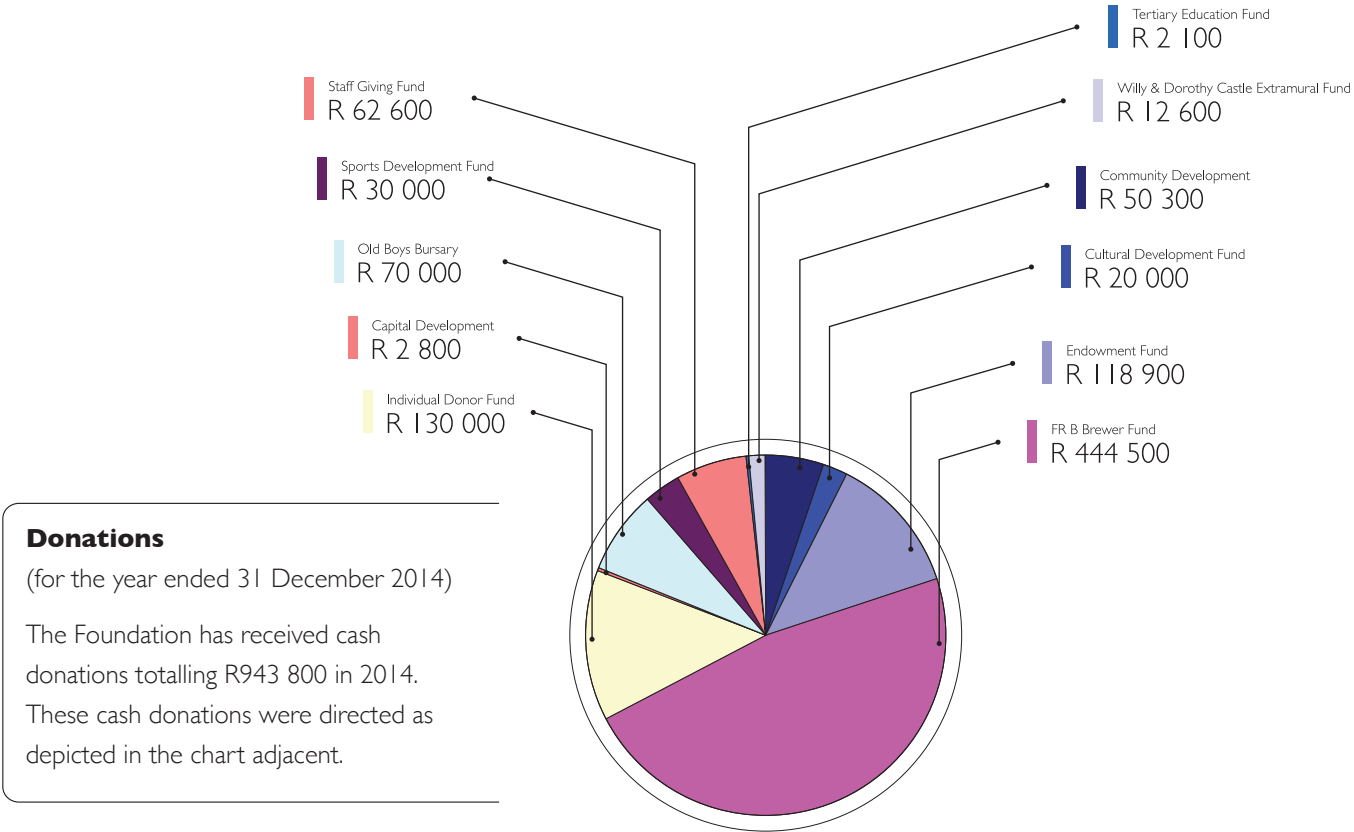

\*Centaur Asset Management have been mandated to invest monies on behalf of the Foundation with a view to long term out performance (of JSE listed equities) and an annual liquidity need of 4-6% of the gross capital, under management, at the beginning of each year.

The Foundations asset manager, Centaur Asset management, led by Roger Williams, reported an Internal Rate of Return of 19%, (2013 – 27%) for assets under its management. The Trustees reviewed the investment strategies and performance of these activities during the year and were satisfied that these remain in line with the Foundations investment plans.

Centaur's strategy is an absolute return strategy with a view to outperformance of the South African equity market as a whole. We are satisfied with the performance of Centaur over the last few years and consider that the mandate has been achieved. We endorse the strategy for the coming year with a high equity weighting and believe that the Foundations planned liquidity needs are sufficiently catered for.

# FUNDING PROGRAMMES

The Foundation can receive both restricted and unrestricted donations. Unrestricted donations are spent at the discretion of the trustees for the purposes that conform to the mission of the School; this provides important flexibility to the trustees and the School Executive. Restricted donations meet the specific aims of donors who may wish to direct their giving at other projects or objectives.

## Bursary Funds

**Father Bernard Brewer S. J Bursary:** The Father Bernard Brewer S. J Bursary enables St David's to support deserving boys with academic potential from a previously disadvantaged background.

**Paul Edey Educators Bursary:** The Paul Edey Educators Bursary enables St David's to make its contribution to teacher development in South Africa by supporting candidates through the school's Teacher Learnership Programme.

**Willy & Dorothy Castle Extramural Bursary:** The Willy & Dorothy Castle Extramural Bursary is awarded to boys who show promise in the areas of sport or cultural whilst being able to maintain the required academic standard.

**Tertiary Education Bursary:** The Tertiary Education Bursary is a grant that is awarded to matric candidates with potential, to further their studies at a tertiary institution of their choice in South Africa, primarily in the field of Education.

**Old Boys' Bursary Fund:** The St David's Marist Old Boys' Bursary is a grant that is awarded by the Marist Old Boys' Association either to the son of an Alumnus or to a candidate identified by the Association.

**Staff Giving Fund:** The Staff Giving Fund currently assists numerous learners with support for uniforms, books, the payment of school tours, and other incidental costs.

**UK Old Boys' Fund:** The UK Old Boys' Fund supports the endeavours of the Foundation by funding bursaries, scholarships and projects as identified by the St David's Marist Foundation UK Charity Trustees.

## Projects and Facilities

The Foundation seeks to provide St David's with funding support for development of the School campus facilities to enhance and support curriculum activities and enable students to experience an education at the highest level.

## The Marist Legacy

This Fund allows donors to plan their giving to the Foundation through their wills. The impact of a bequest reaches far into the future and beyond a lifetime.



### Business in Education Fund

The Business in Education Fund was created to enable enterprises to partner with the Foundation in realising measurable and quality education intervention programmes. The Foundation has both the structure and the strategic approach through which to successfully engage enterprise in this arena and was specifically designed to allow for the separate accounting and reporting process required by the B-BBEE Codes.

### Community Projects and Partnerships

St David's is currently involved in over 24 Community projects across the Preparatory and High School. These projects are aimed at disadvantaged communities and individuals as well as groups of 'at risk' individuals/ groups/ communities. Programmes include educational support and enrichment, sports development, feeding programmes, visitation and financial and resource donations. The programmes are all very 'hands-on' with St David's boys being expected to actively initiate, lead, participate in and commit to programmes and projects. We believe strongly that this is a vital component of a Marist education and fundamental to the development of social awareness, sound values, leadership skills and character formation. It is also an imperative component of St Marcellin's vision and instruction
