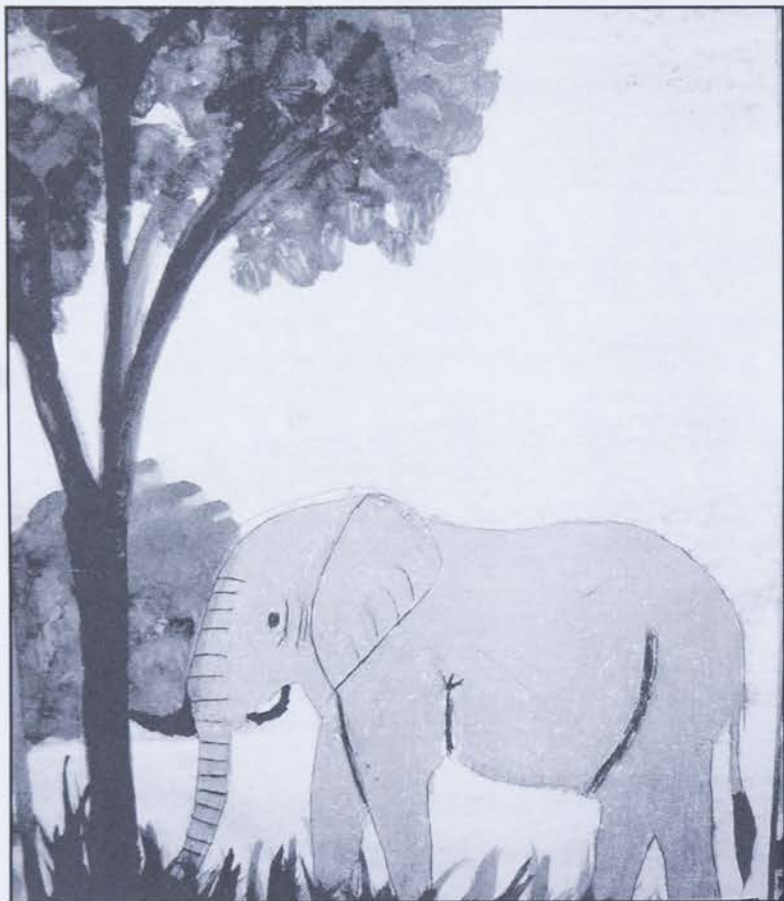
ART

The South African Flag

The shape of our flag, but not its size, is determined by law, as in this sketch:



South Africa's national flag is one of the best-known flags in the world. After more than ten years of democracy our flag still has no name. A process towards finding out what South Africans think their flag should be called has begun. South Africans from all walks of life have made over 100 suggestions for a name.

The national flag was designed by a former South African State Herald, Mr Fred Brownell, and was first used on 27 April 1994. The design and colours are a synopsis of principal elements of the country's flag history. Individual colours, or colour combinations represent different meanings for different people and therefore no universal symbolism should be attached to any of the colours. The central design of the flag, beginning at the flag post in a 'V' form and flowing into a single horizontal band to the outer edge of the fly, can be interpreted as the convergence of diverse elements within South African society, taking the road ahead in unity. The theme of convergence and unity ties in with the motto *Unity is Strength* of the previous South African Coat of Arms.

I can identify with what Mr Winston Churchill meant. I am giving a loud roar today, but on behalf of so many others

The great Churchill also said: "Never in the field of human conflict, was so much owed, by so many, to so few".

The many: being the Gr7 troops – all 75 of us;
The few: being the "special forces", that dedicated group of teachers and staff at St David's; and
The much: well, that is really what my roar is all about today.

All of the great armies of the World have had similar characteristics. Greatness in the qualities of discipline, courage, loyalty, honesty, simplicity and modesty - most of which are at the very core of a Marist education.

Values and qualities are all well and good, but you need real people to demonstrate, teach and live them.

So, just as in a great army, a great school needs human greatness in the areas of:

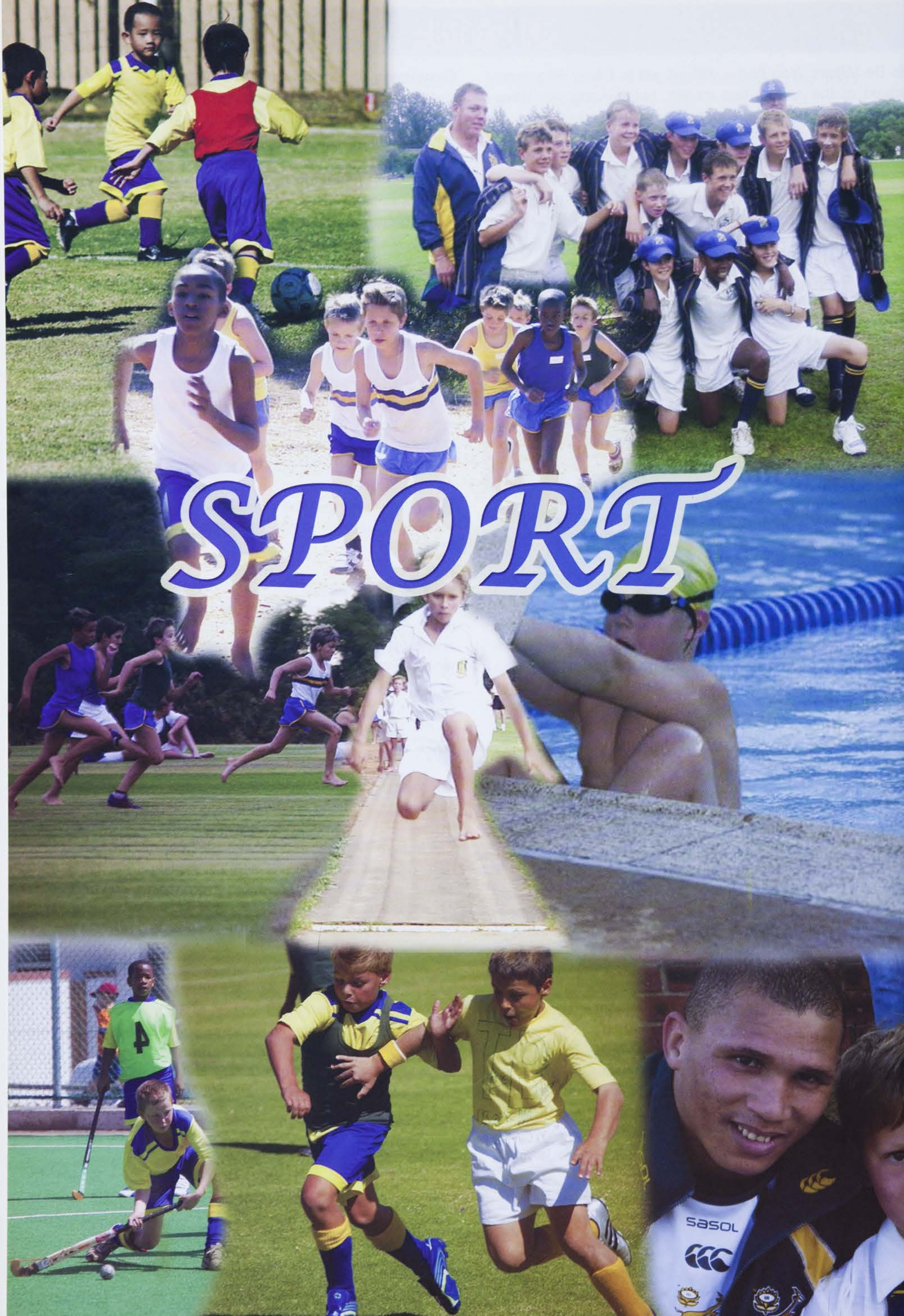

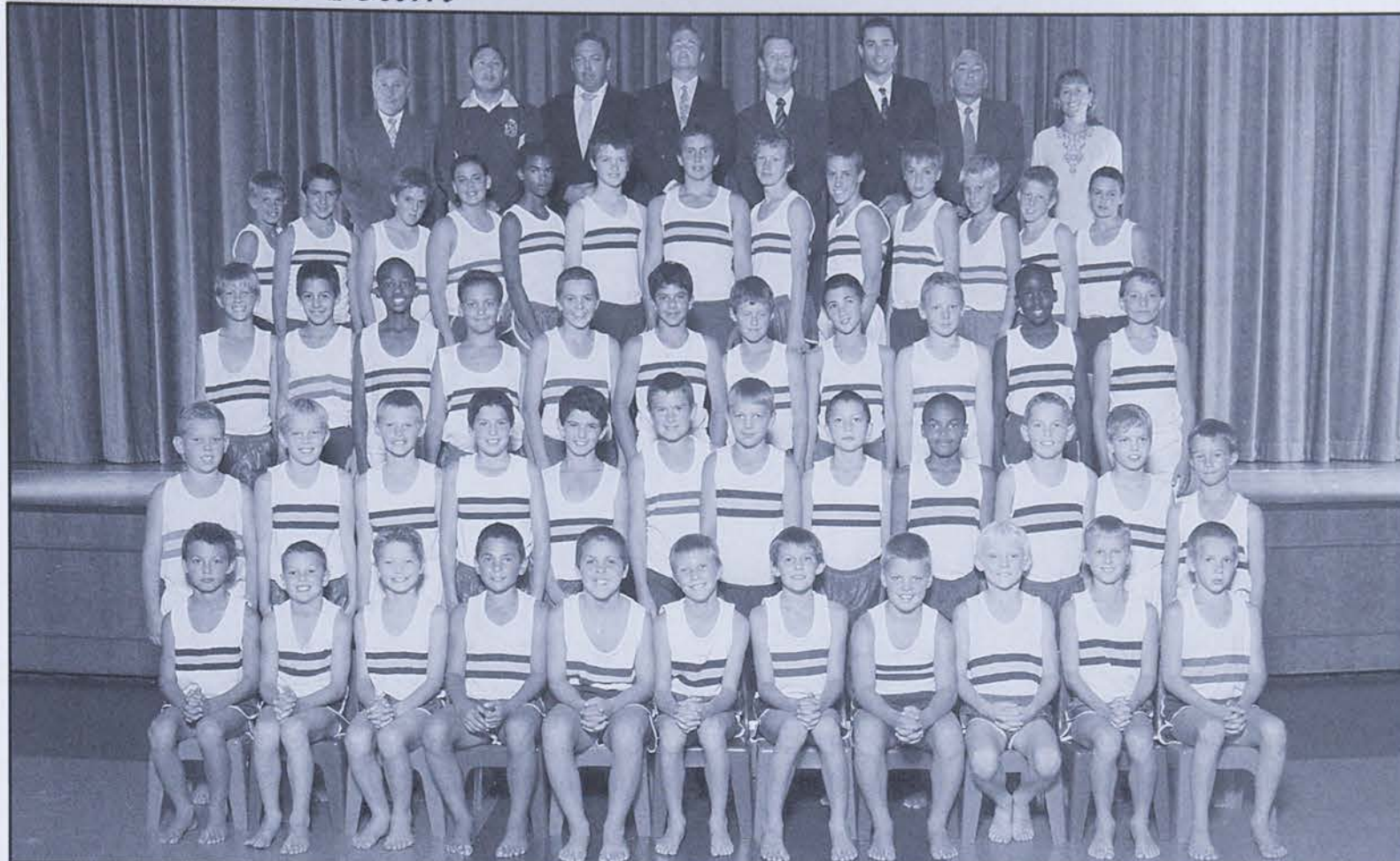

Kimberly Cricket Tour 2007 U/11 Report "No-Balled"
