

Annual Retreat. The Annual Retreat for the Catholic Boys of the College was conducted by the Rev. Fr. Thomas Kelly, O.M.I., of the Oblate Novitiate, Germiston. A departure from other years, beneficial to many, was a preliminary address by the Rev. Preacher explaining the meaning of, the reasons for, and the need of a Retreat. The exercises themselves were followed with remarkable piety and enthusiasm. It is not given to every priest to know the full effect of his influence for good but the apparent devotion of the pupils throughout the exercise must have been a great consolation to Fr. Kelly. The stress laid on the crying need of South African vocations to the Priesthood and the Brotherhood is betimes; undoubtedly many who listened to the fervent exhortations placed before them, will heed the call "Come Follow Me."

College Chaplains. In August we learned with regret that our Parish Priest, Rev. Fr. Roux, O.M.I., and Rev. Fr. McNabb, our Chaplain, were transferred to the parish of

Belgravia. Fr. Roux has been a personal friend and magnanimous supporter of the College since its inception in 1926. His advice has been sought and appreciated by the Superiors who have learnt to value his tact and consideration. Whilst deeply regretting his departure we must not fail to wish him unbounded success in his new sphere of activities.

The Rev. Fr. McNabb was appointed College Chaplain three years ago. During this time he has ever stressed the inestimable importance of "Living the Mass," it is the "Mass that Counts" and the dire necessity of Catholic Action in our days. Boys of the College will remember Fr. McNabb with reverence and respect as an enthusiastic catechist and vigorous preacher.

The College extends its heartfelt sympathy and prayers to Fr. McNabb on the death of his uncle, the world renowned Preacher and Leader in the Catholic Life, the Very Rev. Fr. Vincent McNabb, O.P.

Obituary

Brother Callixte had the distinction of being associated with all the Marist Schools in the Union through his double term of office as Provincial of South Africa. In the "early" days he spent some fruitful years in Koch Street, and indeed he often attributed the disabilities of his declining years to the labours of those historic years on the Rand.

Uitenhage, however, claimed the work of his maturer years and the palmy days of that famous College owed not a little to his wise guidance. Later he applied his vast experience to the task of building up St. Joseph's, Rondebosch, and how successful he was can be seen in the prosperity of this great College.

Finally he settled down in St. Charles, Maritzburg, where the College Council had the full benefit of his ripe experience. His vast correspondence was intensified during the opening years of the present war. Many an Old Boy on the various battle fronts was cheered by a message and a word of consolation from the good Brother. The regret was, therefore, widespread when it became known that he had passed suddenly away in his semi-retirement in Maritzburg.

His qualities were many and varied, posses-

sing as he did a remarkable fund of piety, good sense, prudence and a wit that was sharp but gentle. May he rest in peace!

Brother Artheme who for forty-two years had laboured as a zealous Teacher in the Union, died peacefully at Port Elizabeth towards the end of December last. Many Old Boys who matriculated at Observatory between 1926 and 1935 will remember the rugged figure and powerful voice of their Maths. and Science Master. Always a glutton for work himself, he exacted from his pupils tasks requiring his own unfailing energy. But he loved his work and had the ability to impart a liking for study to others.

On his return from active service in the last War he was appointed to Port Elizabeth, and, after a trip to Europe in 1926, to Observatory. Few understood that during those years he developed a fatal disease of the heart, angina pectoris, incurred indirectly through hardships endured during the War. For fourteen long years he carried his death warrant around with him, never flinching,



REV. BRO. CLEMENT

Assistant Superior General of the Marist Brothers

Rev. Brother Clement, Assistant Superior General of the Marist Brothers of the Schools, has been on an extended visit to South Africa since April in which month he landed in



Durban from Australia. His visit of inspection should have taken place in 1940 but at that time he was living under Vichy rule near Lyons, France. Owing to Italy's entry into the war it was found necessary to transfer the Mother House to its former site at St. Genis. Rev. Bro. Clement had perforce to put up with this voluntary confinement but his persistent efforts to get off to his work were eventually rewarded with permission to cross the frontier into Spain. Brother has many interesting stories to tell of his visits to our Schools in that ravaged land. All are flourishing once more, providing thereby proof that the blood of martyrs is the seed of future prosperity. The two hundred innocent and heroic Brothers who died while doing their duty will protect the future of our Schools in Spain.

By land, sea and air, Brother Clement travelled to Portugal, to the Americas, New Zealand, Australia and finally South Africa. He even found time while the schools were closed in July to make a trip to East Africa. Brother Clement has long since ceased to travel for pleasure but he has an eye for scenic effects all the same and he assures us that we need not be ashamed of local scenery.

He has some interesting observations to make on the fall of France—which he looks upon as a gross betrayal—and upon the German occupation. He has facts and figures to prove the cleverness of the economic scheme under which the conquered countries serve to keep the Reich war effort at its fullest pitch. From his remarks it can be gleaned what a long time will elapse before Europe can possibly be restored to normal.

After a thorough inspection of each school in the Union, Brother Clement intends to return to Australia. He is naturally anxious about one portion of his territory, however, namely the British Isles, which he has not seen since 1939. Knowing him as we do it will be surprising if he does not manage to get there before another year passes. We wish him a safe voyage from our shores, and may he continue for many years to administer the affairs of the British section of the world-wide Marist Order.


Vs. Helpmekaar. This game, one of the keenest played, was marked by its solid scrumming and deadly tackling, and also ended in a draw of six-all.

Inter-Platoon Boxing Competition. year saw the institution of a new feature in the cadet movement of the College—the Inter-Platoon Boxing Competition suggested and ably carried out by our boxing instructor, Mr. Jack O'Malley, assisted by the brothers and various senior officers. The preliminary bouts gave rise to much excitement and the finals were fought on the evening of the 17th September, providing sepctators with

The Marist Brothers' Association Football Club

The 1943 Season has been extremely successful although none of the teams, with the exception of the Under 16 A side, succeeded in winning any trophy.

The Club is extremely proud of the two following records: The first being that out of a membership of 204, 105 are presently on Active Service and the second that an amount of £105 was donated to War This sum of £105 represented Funds. the share of gates due to the Club from War Cup matches for the 1943 Season, but in addition the Club materially assisted the Southern Transvaal Football Association in the latter's magnificent donation of over £2,000 to War Funds. Although the Club has made annual donations since the inception of the War the total sum has never been as large as the figure reached this Season.

The Transvaal league side was unfortunately not as well balanced as in previous years. The Defence consisted of Els, Martyn (Captain), Heuer, Wright (Vice-Captain), Boonzaaier and Durandt, who at all times played magnificent football, but the forwards, primarily through lack of experience, missed and threw away a number of good scoring chances. When Clack was again available from his military duties after August, the forward line was impressive, but the League winners, Germiston Callies, had already obtained too far a lead. The fine football played by the defence is clearly indicated by the fact that fewer goals were scored against the Side than has ever before been recorded against a Transvaal League team. When one bears in mind that the forwards were not scoring as many goals as they should have done, this record is doubly meritorious. The forwards, in fact, scored fewer goals than any other team in the League save one. Unfortunately the Club could not settle down to a regular forward line, particularly as a number of players who were on active service were not always available. Most of the forwards were young players promoted from the junior ranks, Parker and Wagner being under 18 and Pelser, Carew, Vivian and Webster being just over 18. The remaining players were not very much older. Lambe

and Goodwin were only available towards the end of the Season when they were on leave from military duties. The Team as a whole played very good football and in some games were extremely unlucky. The team finished 3rd in the League, which is a very satisfactory performance, as the younger players next year will no doubt benefit from their experience obtained in the past Season.


In the Transvaal War Cup the team reached the Final and were then beaten by Rangers by one goal to nil, before the largest crowd which has ever assembled to see a Soccer Match in South Africa with the exception of matches against overseas teams. In the first round the Club defeated Waterkloof, who were strongly fancied by the Air Force Association, by 3 goals to nil. In the second round, we met Boksburg and played on three successive Saturdays before finally beating them decisively by 4 goals to two. In the Semi-final the team eliminated its old rival and last year's finalist, Delfos, by 2 goals to 1.

The record of the Senior Team for the war period is extremely impressive. In 1940 the team won both the League and the Cup. In 1941, the team won the League, in 1942 the Cup and in 1943 was beaten in the Final and finished 3rd in the League.


The Selection Committee adopted its usual wise policy of encouraging junior players wherever it was deemed advisable and a number of these juniors will no doubt make their mark in South African football. Stan Heuer who took the place of Jack Smith when the latter went "Up North" played brilliant football until he was injured.

The Reserve Side had a fairly successful Season notwithstanding the fact that the most promising players were often called upon to fill vacancies in the Senior Side. The Side was captained by Mr. Fritelli who at all times set a fine example to the other players.

The Club entered two Under 21 teams and two Under 18 Sides, the A teams in each section doing very well and occupying the 3rd position in their respective Leagues. Both

teams further reached the semi-final rounds in the Cup Competitions. The under 18 B side was likewise eliminated in the semi-final. Had the Senior Side not been compelled to call upon the services of a number of Under 21 players there is no doubt that the side would have won the League and possibly the Cup. The Under 18 A side was likewise handicapped by having two of its most promising players called upon for the Senior Team. All the Club's Sides played good football and as the majority of the players will still be available next season in the respective age competitions it is hoped that the sides will be even more successful.

The Club also entered two Under 16 Sides and is very proud of the fact that the A Side won the League and Cup and also the "Anderson Inter-District Cup." baby side of the Club played outstanding football and were extremely popular with Soccer fans in their appearances at the Wanderers. The success of the team was not due to any individual brilliance, but to the marvellous team spirit which prevailed and to the fact that every player pulled his weight at all times. The Under 16 Sides were capably managed by Mr. Jack Kolitz, the Hon. Secretary of the Club, and Mr. Billy Wicks. The Under 16 B Side assisted the A Side materially in winning the League by defeating the runners-up in a most important match. The other teams were managed by Mr. Heuer, Snr., and Mr. E. Hoffmann, and the thanks of the Club are due to all these gentlemen for all their efforts on behalf of the players.

As Mr. Wiltshire, the Hon. Trainer of the Club, desired a rest for a Season his duties were temporarily undertaken by Mr. Syd Martyn, who did everything in his power and succeeded in getting the players as fit as possible. Mr. Cecil Nathan continued to act as Senior Team Manager and his tact and knowledge of the game and his popularity with the players were in great evidence throughout the Season. The Committee desire to place on record its sincere thanks to these two gentlemen for the wonderful services rendered.

This is necessarily a very brief resume of the main activities of the various teams. Mention, however, must be made of the fact that the Club engaged in a number of matches against military teams and teams travelled to various military camps in order to give players in the army as much football as they desired. The Committee, which as usual was an extremely happy family, carried out its duties and onerous tasks to the satisfaction not only of the Club and the Southern Transvaal Football Association, but also the players themselves. The Committee consisted of the gentlemen who have already been mentioned and Mr. W. Gordon as Vice-Chairman, Mr. Barney Wilson, Mr. Gordon Wright, Capt. Folster, Mr. Paton and Mr. H. Harris, as Hon. Treasurer. The finances of the Club have now been established on a solid basis and Mr. Harris is to be commended for his efforts in this direction.

The most important aspect of the past Season is that the traditions of the Club for clean good sportsmanship in the true "Marist" spirit were at all times fully maintained and either as losers or winners the players behaved as sportsmen.

Observatory College Prospectus

The Senior Department of the College occupies a healthy position in the north-eastern suburbs commanding a unique view of the surrounding country. It is within a few minutes of the Yeoville and Observatory trams, also of the Orange Grove and Norwood buses; the Mountain View buses stop at the College entrance.

The spacious grounds are well laid out in playing fields and tennis courts. The College possesses its own swimming bath equipped with a modern filtration plant.

Ample accommodation is provided in the handsome and extensive buildings, which, recently erected, have been designed to ensure the comfort and the health of the pupils.

The aim of the Institution is to provide a sound, moral, intellectual, and physical education. Every boy medically fit is expected to follow the physical culture course.

Pupils are prepared for the Junior Certificate and the Matriculation examinations of the South African Universities, and the Royal College of Preceptors, London.

A Cadet Detachment under military control is attached to the college and every pupil who has attained the age of thirteen is required, under the Defence Act, to join.

The Brothers themselves organise the games and train the boys in every department of sports. Professional coaches are also provided for the most important branches.

Pupils are admitted from Standard II to the Matriculation class, and may enter at any time during the year. Fees are charged only from the date of enrolment.

Application for admission of a pupil to the College must be accompanied by his last school report.

TERMS

There are four terms in the year.

All fees are payable strictly in advance at the beginning of each term.

A term's notice, in writing, or equivalent fee, is required before the withdrawal of a pupil.

£18 per term.

Tuition Fees (including Games, Chemistry, Swimming, Gymnastics and Singing).

Matriculation Class (or Forms IV and V)

To defray expenses in connection with Bioscope the Boarders are charged 10/- per Term.

At the beginning of the scholastic year all Boarders should deposit £2 as office money for the payment of incidentals such as Boot Repairs, Hair Cut, Stamps, etc. Each Boarder keeps a student's account book wherein is recorded the incidentals. These books will be kept in the Bursar's office. The leaflets will be sent tothe parents for their inspection, and when necessary an extra £1 is to supplement the office deposit.

MUSIC

A Term's notice is required before discontinuing music lessons.

In the case of brothers a reduction of 10 per cent. is made for the second and 15 per cent. for the third.

Medical attendance, stationery, repairs to wearing apparel, postage, and sundries are charged for.

Any damage done wilfully or through carelessness to school equipment must be paid for by the individual or individuals responsible.

The College colours, blue and gold, must be worn by every boy.

Visitors are particularly requested not to call during the school hours, which are as follows:—

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday:

Morning: 8.30 to 12.
Afternoon: 1 to 3.15.
Wednesday: 8.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m.

The scholastic year begins in January and ends after the public examinations held in December.

Vacations are: Seven weeks in Mid-summer and four weeks in Mid-winter; during these periods the College is closed.

Progress in studies is tested by periodical examinations, and reports are sent half-yearly to the parents.

Once a month the boarders, whose conduct and application have been satisfactory and whose parents live at a convenient distance, are given leave to visit them from Saturday morning till 6 p.m. on Sunday.

Boarders have a fixed hour once a week to write to

their parents

The Boys may not use the College Telephone. Boarders are not allowed to leave the College premises without the authorisation of the Principal.

The School broke up on 16th April for the Easter vacation, work being resumed on 27th April.


Mr. W. Singleton suffered severe injuries from an accidental fall shortly before Easter, but we are pleased to record that he is now well on the road to complete recovery.







The 1943 season has not been as successful as the previous one, although all our "A" teams and the Under 13 "B" finished near the top of their respective sections.


